Natural Stone Care & Maintenance

Daily Cleaning:

Some regular household cleaners may dull, stain, or damage sealer or natural stone. It is recommended you use non-abrasive, neutral cleansers that are ammonia free to avoid damaging, staining, or stripping the sealer or the stone itself. We recommend StoneTech Professional Revitalizer for daily cleaning, however you may use mild soapy water without lotion or dye additives as well. Do not use scouring powders or creams or cleansers that contain lemon, vinegar or other acids. A mesh covered sponge paired with cleanser will help remove more stubborn food residue.

Preventative Care:

A few precautionary measures will help prevent staining, scratching, and other blemishes on your natural stone. Avoid cutting directly on your natural stone, as this may scratch the surface. Also, do not drop or pound heavy or sharp items on your countertop to avoid cracks or chipping, and use trivets or hot pads under hot items, as this may burn out the sealer and can cause clouding or discoloration. Finally, avoid exposing your stone to oils, citric acids, caustic chemicals, ammonia, etc., as these items can destroy the sealer and damage the top. If a spill occurs, blot up excess with a dry cloth and immediately rinse with water.

Sealing Natural Stone:

Resealing your natural stone countertops will greatly improve your stone's ability to resist discoloration and staining. We recommend sealing your natural stone every six months to 1 year, depending upon how much traffic that area receives. Use a sealer such as StoneTech Impregnator Pro and be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions for proper technique and application.
